PIV stands for "Peaks in the Valley"

PIV stands for Peaks in the Valley, and is a term coined by my organization, INVR Standards / HHEW. PIVs are Black (or Acknowledged African) individuals in leadership positions throughout the Central Valley making a difference based on the TALO Leadership Theory. Please see our Website or sister publication, the *Journal of Unabridged Genius*, for an overview of this theory.

Based on the TALO Leadership Theory, there are eight major leadership profiles. **Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.**, for example, consistently rated a number 4 and 5 profile. Regardless of how one feels about Michael Steele, Ward Connerly or Janice Rogers Brown, they are also bonafide leaders based on the theory's criteria. Personally, I am not fond of their politics, but that does not change the fact that they are leaders.

The TALO Leadership Theory is one of the first systematic and scholarly attempts to match leaders with traditional and current ideologies of Black people worldwide. This helps our communities better understand those serving and claiming to serve in our best interest.
